HAPPY FATHER'S DAY

I heard about a father that sent his daughter an email stating that he was depositing the \$10 she asked for into her account. "But I must call attention to a spelling error in your last email. 10 is written with one zero, not two." Dads like to try to watch the bottom line. The problem is though we keep watching it, we seldom seem to have any control over it.

Dads play a very important role in families and in our world. We need Dads. We need good strong Dads that lead and guide us. We need their strong influence as good role models. We need their support and affirmation. We need their leadership in our churches and in our families. We need to see them practice their faith and putting their faith into action.

Sometimes relationships with Dads become estranged. Sometimes there is a breach of relationship. Sometimes there are misunderstandings. Sometimes there are problems that cause hurt feelings. Sometimes things are said that should not have been said. Sometimes someone overreacts and does something they later regret. Sometimes there is too much neglect.

The story of the Prodigal Son in the Bible is a very powerful story. It is the story of the younger son that leaves with his share of the inheritance and squanders it after a period of time. It is a story of independence and estrangement. It is found in Luke 15:11-24. But it is a story that has a great ending. The father never gives up hope that the son will return and anxiously awaits his reunion. And the son eventually does come back home and initiates the reunion.

Father's Day can be about this for all of us. Father's Day can be about mending fences and reconciliation. It can be about acts of forgiveness. You may need to forgive someone for something they did. Or you may need to ask for forgiveness from someone. What is the relationship like between you and your father? What is the relationship like between you and your children? Father's Day can be a day of return for all of us, if we are willing. Who do you need to reach out to? Will you take the initiative?
