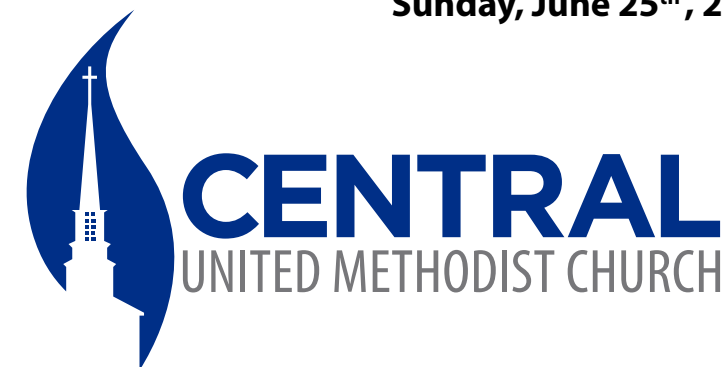

Visions

Many Sundays ago, Pastor J.F. asked the congregation to share with him any visions that we might have for our church or our spiritual walk. I eventually shared my passion and long-time desire to become a Commissioned Stephen Minister. I attend a church at the beach that offers this ministry and I have witnessed the commissioning of Stephen Ministers. This enhanced my interest to research and study the ministry. After several weeks, J.F. and I talked more about the reality of this vision for Central. Pastor J.F. discussed with me the overwhelming needs of our congregation. A trained Stephen Minister can assist our pastor to fulfill these needs of our members.

You might ask "What is Stephen Ministry?" Stephen Ministry is the one-to-one caring ministry that takes place in congregations that use the Stephen Series System. The system equips and empowers lay caregivers to provide high - quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are hurting. To better describe, Stephen Ministers are laypeople – men and women – trained to provide one-to-one care to people experiencing a difficult time in life, such as hospitalization, grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, loneliness and discouragement. Other needs include supporting a caregiver who is caring for a dying loved one, those facing unemployment and financial stress, being homebound, or in rehabilitation. Single parents can benefit as they may be overwhelmed, new parents, and even empty nesters can need care. The list of needs is endless. Stephen Ministers come from all walks of life. Their commonality is they share a passion for bringing Christ's love and care to people during a time of need.

Trenten and I have agreed to become Stephen Ministry trained. We will return to Central to share our training with those of you who feel God's calling to serve in this capacity. The training is extensive and very much a commitment. But then, anything worth doing is intense and requires us to be committed. Our congregation will become a Stephen Ministry registered church in which we can reap the Stephen support and benefits for the lifetime of our church.

Is there a place for you in the Stephen Ministry program? Please begin to pray and seek God's direction. As lay ministers assist our pastor, more individual needs are met, more lives are changed, and the church grows stronger in love.

(Stephen - Profile – NIV Application Study Bible) Stephen was a martyr. Before people can "give" their lives for the gospel, however, they must first live their lives for the gospel. **Stephen was chosen to provide caring ministry to those in need.**
